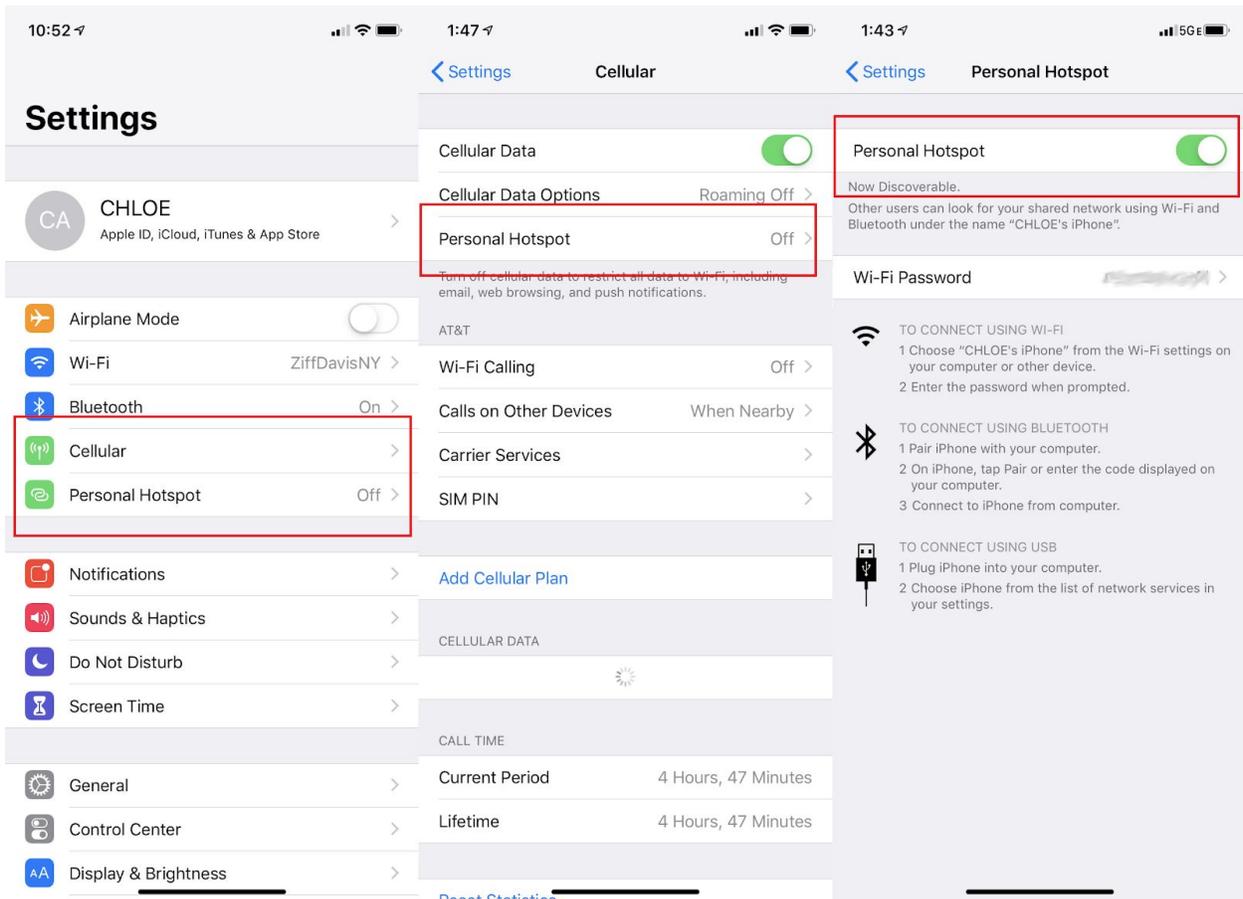


How To Turn Your Cell Phone Into A Hotspot

iPhone



Go to Settings > Personal Hotspot and toggle it on (if you don't see Personal Hotspot in Settings, tap Cellular > Personal Hotspot). Make note of the Wi-Fi password.



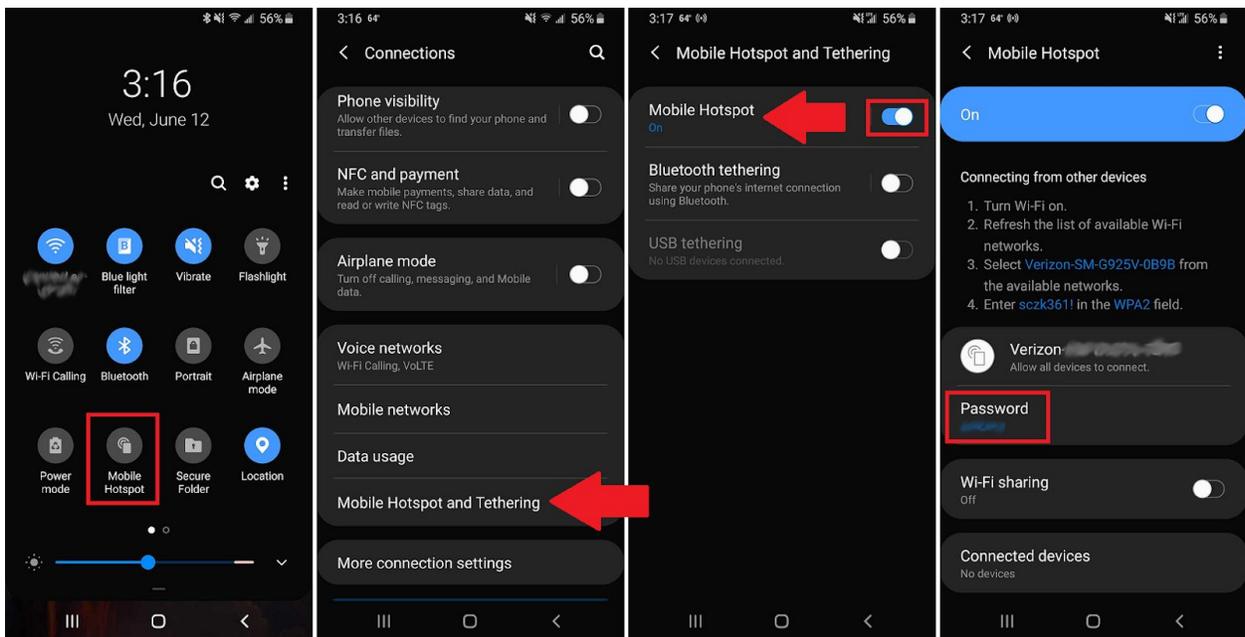

Option 1: Pull down and tap the Mobile Hotspot option in the menu to activate.

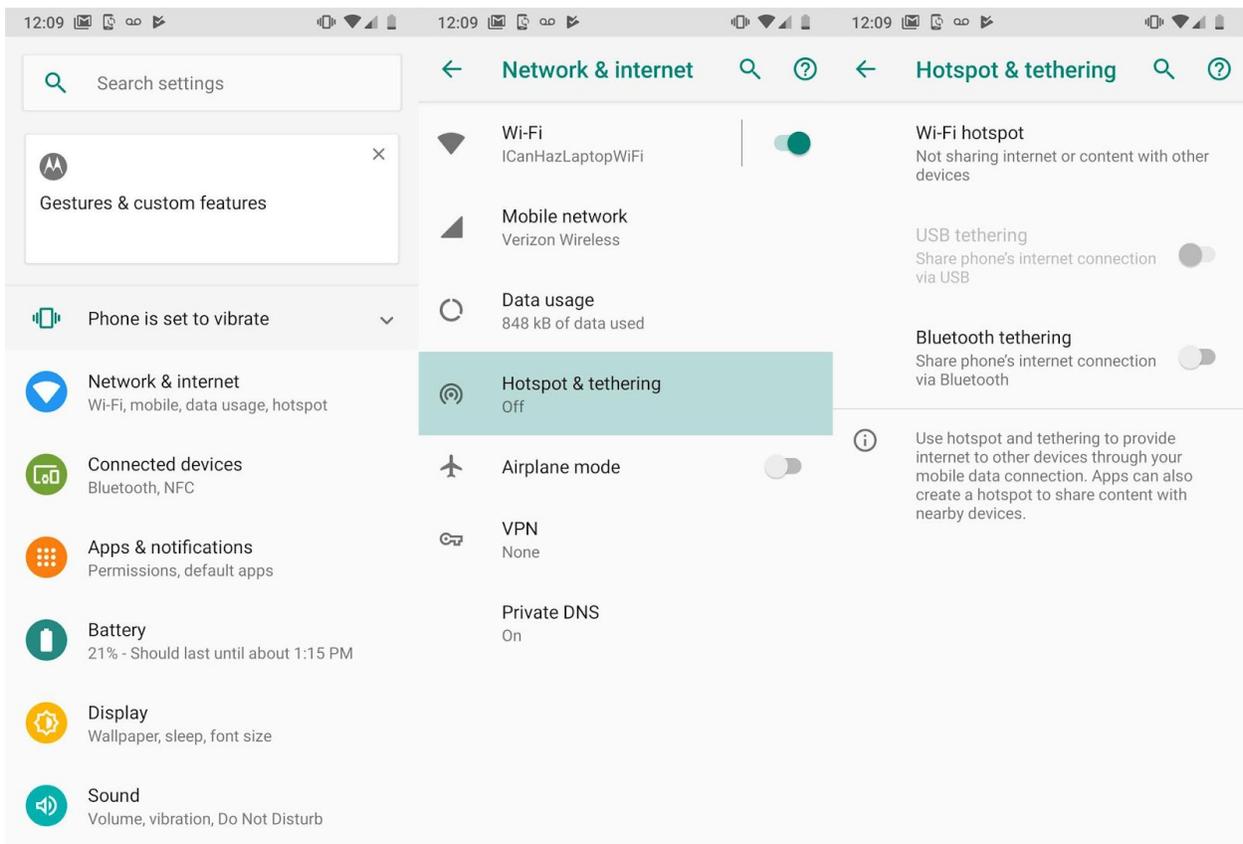
Option 2: Navigate to Connections > Mobile Hotspot and Tethering > Mobile Hotspot and toggle it on. A pop-up window will appear, where you can find the Wi-Fi password for devices that want to connect.



Motorola Moto



Goto Settings > Network & internet > Hotspot & tethering. Here, you can select to share a connection via Wi-Fi, USB, or Bluetooth.

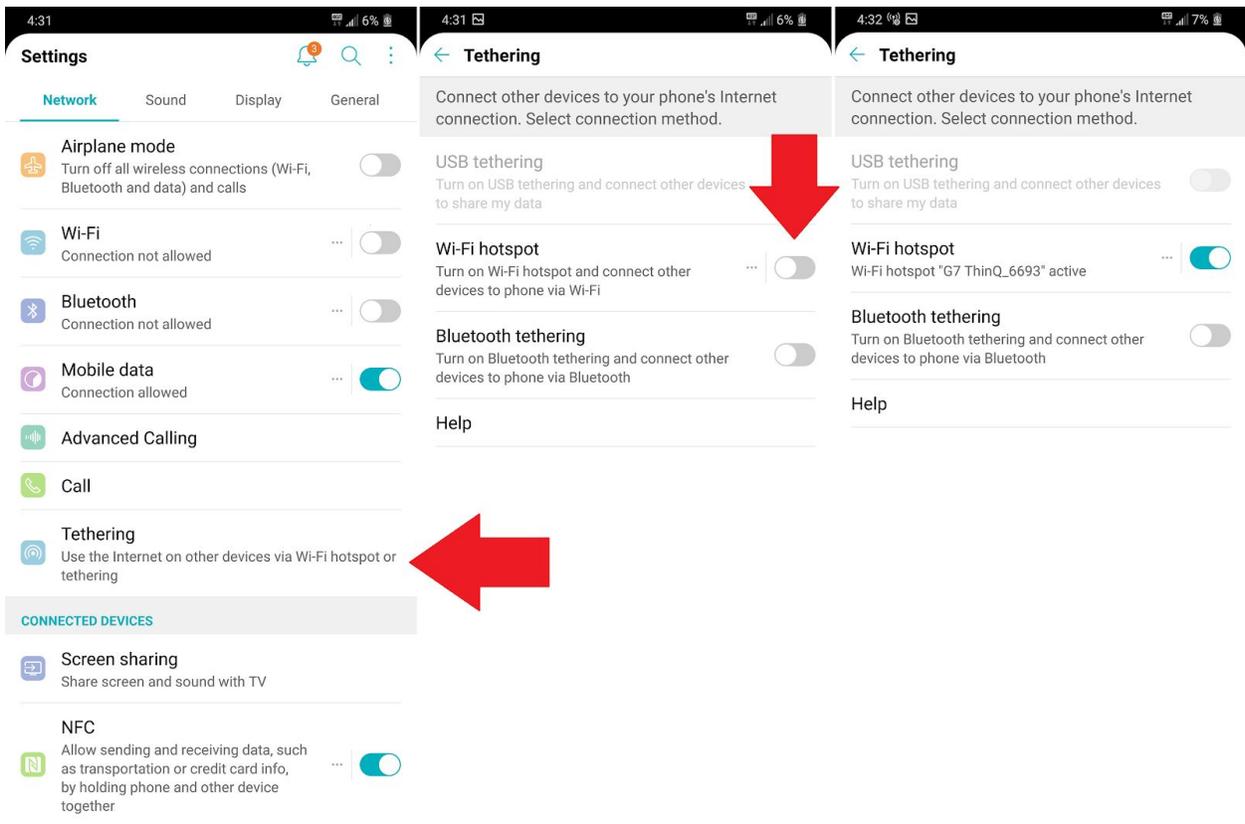

Pull down from the top of the screen and select Settings > Tethering. Then toggle the Wi-Fi hotspot switch to on.

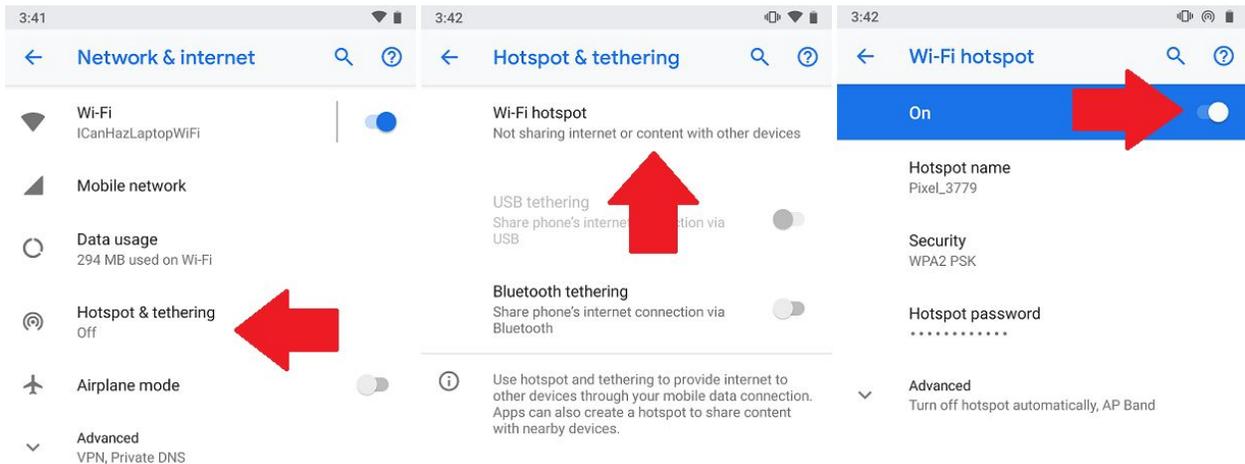

Pull down from the top of the screen and navigate to Settings > Network & Internet > Hotspot & Tethering > Wi-Fi Hotspot, and toggle the switch to on. The hotspot name and password will then be visible.

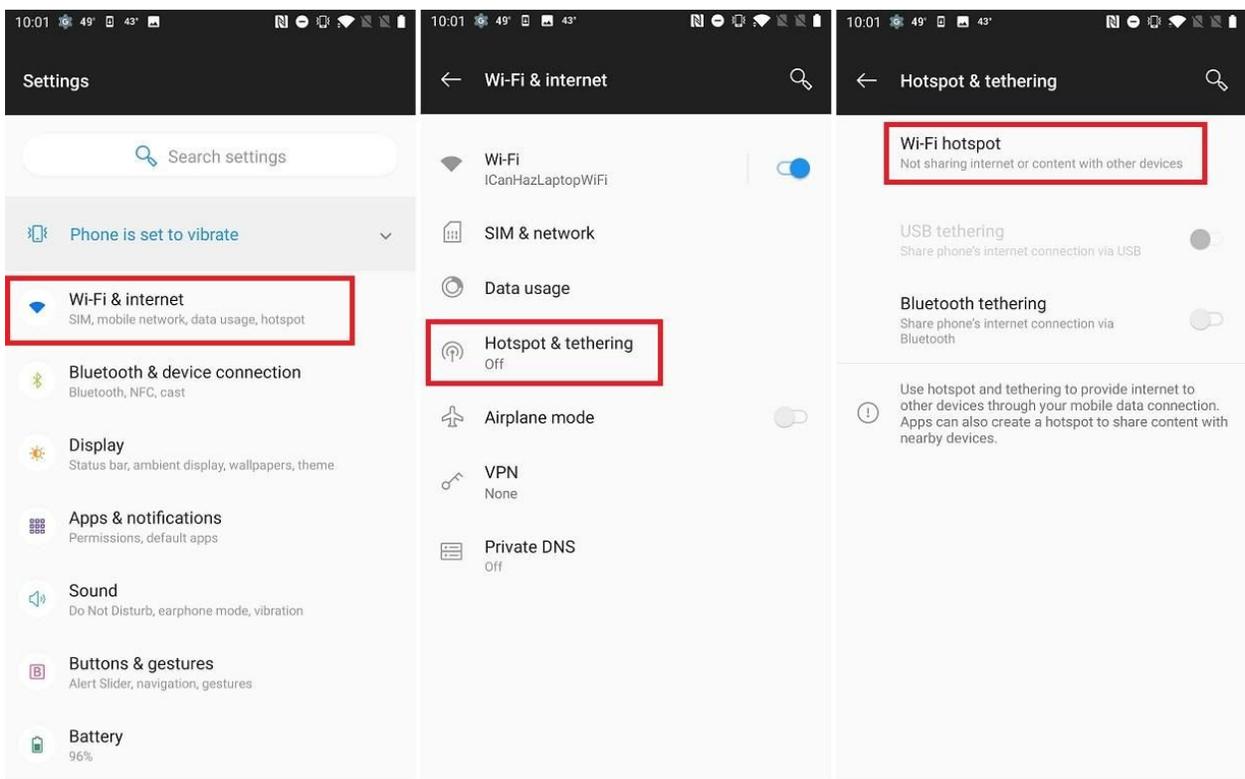

Swipe up from the bottom of the screen, then select Settings > Wi-Fi & internet > Hotspot & Tethering and make sure the switch up top is toggled on.

Navigate to Settings > Wireless & networks > Tethering & portable hotspot > Portable Wi-Fi hotspot. Choose Configure Wi-Fi hotspot to set a name, security setting, and password for your hotspot, then tap Save.
